1. Gen-Z and Their Political Expectations

Generation Z, those born roughly between 1997 and 2012, has emerged as a distinct demographic with unique political preferences shaped by growing up in an era defined by rapid technological advancements, social media, and significant global challenges. Approximately 32% of the global population belongs to Gen-Z, making them a critical group in shaping the future political landscape.

Globally, Gen-Z is characterized by a strong commitment to social justice, environmental sustainability, and inclusivity. A survey conducted by Deloitte found that climate change ranks as the top concern for Gen-Z worldwide, with over 67% seeing it as

a personal and existential threat. This generation tends to advocate for comprehensive policies that address climate change, such as the Green New Deal in the United States, and they are more likely to support political leaders who prioritize sustainability and environmental protection.

Social justice is another cornerstone of Gen-Z's political agenda. This generation is highly engaged in movements for racial equality, gender rights, and LGBTQ+ issues, often using digital platforms to mobilize and amplify their voices. For example, the global Black Lives Matter movement saw significant participation from Gen-Z, who used social media to organize protests and spread awareness.

Mental health is also a key issue for Gen-Z, with a growing number advocating for policies that address mental health crises, reduce stigma, and increase access to mental health services. Studies show that Gen-Z is more likely than previous generations to suffer from anxiety and depression, making mental health a top priority in their political considerations.

Bangladeshi Gen-Z Expectations: In Bangladesh, Gen-Z comprises about 38% of the total population, equating to roughly 65 million individuals. Their expectations are shaped by the country's unique socio-economic challenges. While they share global concerns such as climate change and social justice, they are also deeply focused on issues like employment, education, and governance.

A significant portion of Bangladeshi Gen-Z is concerned with the quality and accessibility of education. With Bangladesh's education system facing challenges such as overcrowded classrooms, outdated curricula, and inadequate facilities, Gen-Zers are increasingly demanding reforms. They seek better quality education that prepares them for the global job market, emphasizing STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) education and digital literacy.

Employment is another critical concern. With youth unemployment rates hovering around 10%, many Gen-Zers in Bangladesh fear the lack of job opportunities upon graduation. This concern is compounded by the fact that the country's economy, while growing, still struggles to create enough high-quality jobs to meet the demands of a rapidly expanding young population. Gen-Z expects the government and political parties to prioritize job creation, vocational training, and support for entrepreneurship.

Corruption and governance are also major issues for Bangladeshi Gen-Z. They are increasingly frustrated with the widespread corruption that affects every level of society, from public services to political institutions. This generation demands greater transparency, accountability, and rule of law from their leaders. They are vocal about the need for political reforms that would reduce the influence of money in politics and ensure fair and free elections.

2. Demographics of Gen-Z in Bangladesh

Population and Distribution: Bangladesh has a youthful population, with Gen-Z representing around 38% of the total population. This translates to approximately 65 million people. The distribution of this population is as follows:

- **Dhaka-Centric (Elite Class):** About 15% of Bangladeshi Gen-Z, or roughly 9.75 million individuals,

are centered in Dhaka, belonging to the elite class. This group has access to superior education, healthcare, and economic opportunities. They are typically more engaged with global issues and expect policies that align with international standards, such as advanced education systems, entrepreneurship support, and digital economy integration.

- **Outside Dhaka (Middle and Low Class):** The remaining 85%, or about 55.25 million Gen-Z individuals, live outside Dhaka. Of these, a large segment belongs to the middle and lower socioeconomic classes. These individuals face significant challenges in accessing quality education, healthcare, and employment opportunities. Their expectations from political parties are focused on immediate and practical concerns such as improving public education, job creation, healthcare services, and infrastructure development.
 - **Middle Class:** Approximately 35% of Gen-Z outside Dhaka, around 19.34 million, fall into the middle class. This group aspires to better economic stability, affordable healthcare, and education reforms that can elevate their social standing.
 - **Lower Class:** The lower-class segment, making up about 50% of the Gen-Z population outside Dhaka (around 27.63 million), is primarily concerned with basic needs such as food security, primary healthcare, and access to fundamental educational opportunities. Their political expectations revolve around welfare programs, poverty alleviation, and enhanced access to government services.

3. Strategies for BNP to Attract Bangladeshi Gen-Z

Given the diverse and widespread nature of Gen-Z in Bangladesh, the BNP (Bangladesh Nationalist Party) can adopt targeted strategies to resonate with this demographic:

- ❖ **Digital Engagement and Transparency:** BNP needs to significantly enhance its digital presence. With Gen-Z being digital natives, they expect political engagement to occur on platforms where they are active, such as social media.
